The city of Lüdenscheid in North Rhine-Westphalia, Germany, has been presented with the DEKRA Vision Zero Award. The DEKRA road safety experts are recognizing the city's achievement of zero traffic fatalities in seven consecutive years from 2012 to 2018. This is the fourth time that the leading international expert organization has presented this award at its annual event in Brussels. Mayor Dieter Dzewas accepted the award from DEKRA CEO Stefan Kölbl.

For the interactive world map at www.dekra-vision-zero.com, the DEKRA experts continuously evaluate the latest available accident statistics. For many European countries, the USA, Japan and now also Canada, Mexico and Australia, the map shows the towns and cities with over 50,000 inhabitants that have achieved zero traffic fatalities in at least one year since 2009. Lüdenscheid has around 74,000 inhabitants.

"I'm delighted that our efforts to achieve the very highest levels of road safety – particularly for the most vulnerable road users – have been rewarded in this way. This award is a fantastic achievement for the city of Lüdenscheid and was made possible by the outstanding cooperation between councilors, administrators and committed citizens," said Mayor Dzewas on accepting this prestigious award.

"Not just our award-winners, but all the many other towns and cities worldwide are testament to the fact that 'Vision Zero' is not merely some Utopian concept," said DEKRA CEO Stefan Kölbl. "Overall, of course, the ultimate objective of zero traffic fatalities is far from a reality, but our data shows that at least 1,100 towns and cities have already partially achieved this objective within their sphere of responsibility. The fact remains, however, that any traffic fatality is one too many." Kölbl went on to say that we must continue our efforts to get ever closer to achieving zero traffic fatalities in even more towns and cities as well as outside of urban centers.
